**April 6, 2008**

**"Recognizing Jesus Christ"**

All of us long for the kind of journey Cleopas and the other disciple experienced on the first Easter as they walked along their seven mile trek to Emmaus. They had heard stories from some of the women followers of Jesus that he was no longer dead but had arisen. They had trouble believing this *too good to be true* hallucination.

They felt weary and defeated. It would be a long walk home. They saw a stranger and invited him to walk with them. They continued discussing Jesus' crucifixion and reports of his resurrection. The *stranger* asked them what they were talking about. They treated the *stranger* as if he must have been in a coma. *Everyone* in the region knew what happened to Jesus. This *stranger* had to be *really out of it*.

Imagine their surprise when the *stranger* started talking with them about the prophecies of the Old Testament that pointed ahead to the life, death, and resurrection of One sent from God to save the world from sin.

Now, when it came to preaching, no one could preach a better sermon than Jesus Christ. Still, Cleopas and the other disciple had no idea the person who had been speaking with them was not a stranger but Jesus himself. "Their eyes were kept from recognizing him." (Luke 24:16). Apparently, the time was not right for God to make the risen Christ known to the disciples.

It was not until after they invited the *stranger* to stay with them that Jesus took the bread, blessed and broke it, that they realized they were in the presence of the risen Christ. Immediately Jesus vanished from their sight.

It took Cleopas and the other disciple a long time to walk from Jerusalem to Emmaus. After dinner, they traveled back to Jerusalem so fast they probably set a world record for the seven mile dash.

Along the journey of discipleship and Christ-like transformation, there are times Jesus walks with us and we don't even realize it. Then there are times when he makes himself known. The **basic ingredients** of this journey include **companionship**. Cleopas and another follower walked with him. The **scriptures**...Jesus helped them understand the meaning of the Hebrew texts. **Hospitality**...The disciples invited the *stranger to break bread with them*. **Memory**...Cleopas and the other disciple remembered all that Jesus had told them and how their hearts had burned when he spoke. **Witnessing**...They could not wait to return to Jerusalem to share the *Good News*.

**Graduates**

**Church Energy and Water Consumption Monitored**

Water and utility bills are checked each billing cycle for signs of waste or a problem. Twice a year food coloring is poured in all toilet tanks in the late evening and checked the next morning for any signs signaling a leak. The church alarm system monitors for natural gas leaks twenty four hours a day.

**Church Energy Reduction**

Digital heating and cooling time clocks are used for weekly Worship and other standard weekly gatherings at the church. If your meeting is not a standard every week meeting, and you use the hand turned hourly timers, please use only the least time needed. Remember the buildings are heated and cooled by zones. Also, help conserve energy by turning off lights in classrooms, restrooms, and other area.

In keeping with standard energy savings methods, we will begin trying reducing the temperature by two degrees during heating season and increasing the temperature by two degrees in the cooling season. Please dress accordingly.

The outdoor gas lights will be turned on for special evening services.

**Church Hot Water Heaters**

The sanctuary heater is a ten gallon tank on a time clock that allows electricity to flow to the heater, if needed, only five hours per day.

The main gas water heater in the fellowship hall helps cover the kitchen needs. When a meal or covered dish is served in the fellowship hall, the water heater will now need to be manually switched from warm/vacation to hot and returned to warm/vacation after the event. See or call Jim Waynick for assistance with this energy savings.

The auxiliary electric water heater is on warm/vacation unless it is needed for a big meal or event.

**Shelter Energy Reduction**

The shelter kitchen and bath was designed around energy reduction. The bathroom area is designed to keep pipes from freezing in the winter. The water heater is off unless needed for an event. Several of the refrigerators and the freezer are off completely unless needed for an event.
