“The Work of Jesus Christ Empowers”

We live in a day and time in which most people define the word *work* as a four letter word. The majority of people in the USA do not enjoy their work; neither do they find it rewarding. Most persons view work as a necessary evil to pay the bills. Followers of Jesus Christ look at the meaning of work in different ways.

First of all, we recall what Jesus told his disciples prior to his crucifixion and resurrection. Jesus said, “Very truly, I tell you, the one who believes in me will also do the works that I do and, in fact, will do greater works than these, because I am going to the Father.” (John 14:12).

The apostle Paul presented several metaphors that describe the work of the community of disciples of Jesus Christ known as the church. He referred to disciples as servants in God’s field and as carpenters in God’s building. (See 1 Corinthians 3:5-23.)

Likewise, the apostle Paul referred to the work of the church as “building up the body of Christ until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ”. (Ephesians 4:12).

God, is it possible that we may even become real excited about working in your kingdom? Please make it so.
