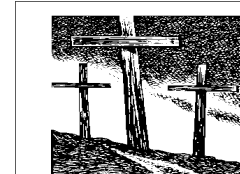

### Facts: World Hunger and Health

One-third of the population of sub-Saharan Africa is chronically undernourished. Nearly half live on less than \$1 a day. In Central Africa, 55 percent of the population is hungry.

Worldwide, more than half of all child deaths are due to malnutrition. Six million children under age five die of hunger-related causes each year.

Hundreds of millions of people worldwide suffer from micronutrient malnutrition, often called "hidden hunger." They do not get enough of such nutrients as vitamin A, vitamin C, iron, iodine, zinc, and selenium.

In 2002 alone, HIV/AIDS killed 3.1 million people. More than 38 million people in developing countries are currently living with HIV/AIDS.

In sub-Saharan Africa, about nine percent of the population ages 15 to 49 is HIV-positive. In four countries, more than 30 percent of people in this age group are living with HIV/AIDS. The epidemic has reduced life expectancy in some African countries to less than 40 years. Effective antiretroviral therapy for HIV/AIDS is now available in poor countries for less than \$1 per patient per day. But despite this reduced cost, only 50,000 of the 4.5 million Africans who need the therapy have access to it -- one person in 90.
