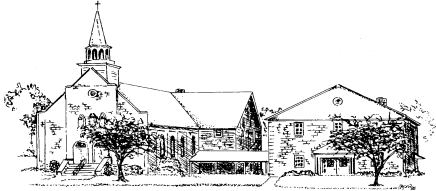

FROM PASTOR DONNA

So, how is it with your soul?

I attended a district clergy meeting recently and before getting out of my Kia Soul, I noticed one of my clergy friends was also driving a Kia Soul. I watched to see who it was so that I could ask them "how it is with your soul?" It was Pastor Jonathan Marlowe from the Gibsonville UMC. I asked him the question and we both had a good laugh about being preachers driving "souls". I told him about the day it was supposed to hail and my husband insisted on parking the Soul inside the garage so that it wouldn't get any hail damage. (Hope you are getting a good laugh-that is the intent.

Hopefully it is well with your spiritual and any other kind of "soul" you may be holding on to. We are quickly approaching the spiritual season called "Lent", and no it has nothing to do with the stuff we clean out of belly buttons or dryer filters. According to our UM Book of Worship, Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday (February 22nd) and ends on Holy Saturday (April 7th, the day before Easter).

The word "lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten" which means "spring". The season of Lent is a time of preparing for Easter. (Much like Advent is preparing for Christmas) Lent began as a season of fasting and preparing for baptism by converts and became a time of penance by all Christians. The first Sunday during Lent describes Jesus' temptation by Satan and the final Sunday recognizes Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem as well as his passion and death. The highlight of the Lenten season is called The Great Three Days from sunset on Holy Thursday through sunset on Easter Day. These three days proclaim the mystery of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. During these days Christians often accompany Jesus on his journey from the Upper Room, to the cross, to the tomb and to the Garden of Gethsemane. Come and join us on the journey here at Hinshaw UMC.

New Small Group Study Beginning February 5th ***Seeing Gray: Where Faith and Politics Meet***

An increasing number of Christians today are finding it difficult to identify with the various "sides" of the theological divide. Even our most basic ways of categorizing people point us to the truth that the world is not always black and white, and more often than not, we find ourselves somewhere in the gray between the two. As

Christians we may be drawn to a more centered faith due to frustration with the role Christianity has played in the culture wars. Too often we find that faith has been used by both Christian leaders and politicians to further a political agenda.

This study aims to explore these questions:

How can our faith lead us?

How does our faith call us to be engaged in the public arena?

How can we do that in a way that is faithful to what Jesus taught?
